- Principal's Report - Dave Burgess
- Bingo - a success! We now have a packed food pantry. Nice to be able to do it indoors. Impressed with food trucks and better wait times.
- Mastery Connect - assessment testing coming Friday and Monday. Will collect data that helps us fine tune areas of concern to be SC ready.
- Job Fair - we have one opening for a teacher position, potentially two. We have some great candidates.
- Atrium - curtain is a bust due to the infrastructure. We would lose valuable stage area, so the project is on permanent hold. Instead, looking into a portable stage for outdoor use, and some potential PE equipment.
- The Leader In Me program - this year we are training on Covey's 7 Habits of Highly Effective People. We have a lighthouse team made of 7-12 staff members that go through the official program training. The program helps develop their own voice, a great way to help kids shine and develop leadership skills. It's a yearlong planning process.
- Field Trips - do we want to continue doing overnight field trips. DC will be $\$ 600+$, Charleston is $\$ 400+$ for 1 night. Need to discuss how to best get the right feedback from parents on thoughts regarding overnight trips, costs, and how to help every kid go. Going to test out a raffle at Carnival this year, proceeds go towards the scholarship fund.
- Enrichments - suggestion to list the cost in advance before people fill out the Google form expressing interest.
- Retention Pond in Sugar Creek - potential backup issue. Mr Burgess to look into it and potential clean-out. There is a 50 ' rule where we can't do anything with property, the drainage ditch should catch most of our runoff water. The district came out and cleaned out the side.


## - Treasurer's Report - Nicole Bengard

- Total revenue $\$ 114 \mathrm{~K}$, expenses $\$ 103 \mathrm{~K}$, and net is $\$ 11 \mathrm{k}$ through Feb. Ending cash $\$ 49 \mathrm{~K}$. Expenses are on track and looking good. Expecting a great March.
- Generated income from spirit wear, school store, boulder sales and skate day.
- We are over budget in curriculum enhancements due to purchase of a poster maker plus 2 years' worth of supplies - funded from Booster-thon, which has $\sim \$ 15 \mathrm{~K}$ left to spend
- We have spent all of the restricted Backpack Buddy funds and had a successful Bingo with a full closet of food.
- Copier - we are looking to be on track to go over budget with upcoming events like carnival. We have room in the budget.
