- The Motion carried, and the minutes were approved.
- **Principal's Report Mr. Burgess**: Very excited to be back after hip replacement surgery! Missed the month of September followed along from home and very proud of all the things that happened and the level of success for all of them. Thank you!!
 - Over \$25k brought in at the Book Fair/Grandparents' Week.
 - School Report Cards will be out soon. 13-15 categories in Excellent category but one 2.9 (state average is 3.0) so that cost us an "Excellent" rating down to "Good."
 - Ranked 5th in Elementary Schools.
 - BV ranks 3rd in GCS with number of home languages spoken this speaks to our diversity.
 - BV at 34% this fall for Pupils in Poverty. A couple of years ago we were at 20-22%. This means things like Backpack Buddies not just taking care of our kids but also sometimes taking care of their families. So, so important for those kids to know when they get here, they will be fed and taken care of, but also that we send food home on Fridays.
 - School Report Cards compare schools with similar size, PIP, diversity, etc. and we are light years ahead of some of our peers that face the same challenges.

The big news is the Boosterthon Fun Run this month. Before we get to that, I want to go over a few line items on the financial statements.

Spirit Wear/School Store

We completed our fall sale and held a pop-up sale during Open House that sold inventory from previous years as well as excess new inventory that we had on hand to sell. We sold \$536.57, net of credit card fees, worth of inventory at the Open House and \$3,411.33 during the fall sale. Our total net income from these sales is \$1,549.66. Our School Store had net sales of \$124 for the month of September.

Spirit Fundraisers

Our spirit fundraiser chairs tried something new at Open House - Hot and Ready pizza sales from Papa Johns. We sold 100 pizzas for \$12 at a cost of \$8. Our profit on these pizzas was \$342.42. In addition, Papa Johns graciously allowed us to share in their BV profits that evening, which resulted in an additional \$148.32. In total, this effort generated net income of \$490.74.

Skate Day generated net income of \$273 in September (127 skates, 165 glow sticks).

Backpack Buddies

We received a grant from Spartanburg Regional totaling \$2,500 to fund our Backpack Buddies program. In addition, some families in Sugar Creek gathered and sold Halloween Costumes and donated the \$100 proceeds to the BVPTA, specifically for the Backpack Buddies Program. You will see this \$2,600 recorded in the Zero Income Backpack Buddies line item on the Income Statement.

On the expense side:

- We paid \$70 for State PTA dues.
- We renewed our annual GoDaddy (website) and Square subscriptions (credit card sales). You will see these recorded in Community Relations.

Boosterthon/Fun Run

We will have final numbers from Boosterthon tomorrow. As of right now, we have collected \$64,779.10 in donations. The expense that you see of \$345 is the cost of class T-shirts for students who could not afford to purchase them. The plan was for all students to wear their class shirts during the run, but the vendor failed to meet the deadline, unfortunately.

• Committee Reports:

- Membership Laura Stoner: Membership officially closed on September 30.
 308 memberships were purchased. 94% of the PTA Board purchased a membership. The breakout of memberships purchased is as follows: 38 faculty, 216 parent, and 54 student.
- Backpack Buddies Mary Latrick & Layne Morton: 1st food drive of the year was a big success so thank you! Should supply us through the end of September. 45 kids enrolled in BB this year. Compared to 34% PIP per Mr. Burgess, that would be roughly 275 kids so BB could serve SO MANY more kids. It is an opt in program so there are families that choose not to apply bc don't want to be singled out. Next food drive is in November and we meet before then so will have specific list of items needed then.
- Boosterthon Sarah Beth Wood & Sara Jackson:
 - Survey sent out for feedback 22 responses.
 - Feedback this year lots of comments about the setup/location.
 - Financially:
 - 76% of students registered; 60% made a pledge of some sort.
 - Of pledges: 34% parents, 40% grandparents, 26% other.
 - All \$ get deposited into our account, then we write them check for their fee.
 - Did full service plan this year so had to pay retainer of \$2,000 last year when we booked dates.
 - See photo of dry erase board.
 - Brief history: Have done in house and Boosterthon in the past. Tried
 Boosterthon the past 2 years hard pill to swallow how much we pay to
 Boosterthon in fees 50% which is roughly \$30k each of the past 2 years.
 - Discussion/suggestions:
 - Keep class prizes but what if no individual prizes?
 - Layne idea for each grade to have an organization to learn about/donate to and instead of giving prizes, donate to a charity.
 - Lots of discussion about the future. Continue with Boosterthon, go back to homegrown Fun Run, change up event and do something different??

- MasterMinds Melissa Bache: 15 kids total this year; currently have 4 students that have not been matched up with a volunteer. Melissa will get with Barb to fill with grandparents.
- SIC (School Improvement Committee) Melissa Bache: Great group this year.
 - Coming soon FAQ section on the website.
 - Also in the works, a video on morning carline procedures.
- Grandparents Club Barbara Brown: 38 grandparents signed up, 28 attended first meeting. Please let Barb know when you have any volunteer needs so she can fill.
- School Store Ramya Ramkumar: Order has been placed but not picked up.
 Been slow this year. Will pump up social media/advertising once order comes in.
- Book Fair Stacy Edwards: Fall Book Fair was a BIG success! PTA supplied volunteers, school handled the rest.
- Spirit Nights Megan Saltmarsh & Corey Gilbreath: Papa Johns was a big hit at Open House – very well received. Papa Johns also great to work with! More sales later than earlier. Made about \$490.
 - Jersey Mike's also went well made \$134. Week-long event.
 - Tipsy Taco this coming Tuesday at the Pelham Road location.
 - Duck Donuts Tuesday 11/14.
 - Nothing in December.
- Staff Appreciation Jen Holly & Alicia Kamlet: Tailgating food themed lunch was a big success – lots of really good food donated. Enough leftovers to donate to fire station afterwards. Teachers really loved it.
 - Went smoothly as far as volunteers. Change this year is only lunch, not covering recess.
 - Suggestion about how to encourage food donations (more so than monetary) but also to request from larger group than just the PTA Board.
 Maybe let a grade be responsible for each one and send out requests through Room Moms to classes.
- Red Ribbon Week Andreen Grubbs: Coming up October 23 31. Ribbons have been ordered. School mostly in charge of.
